

CONTRIBUTE TO SAFE CARGO OPERATIONS ON OFFSHORE SUPPORT VESSELS (MARA007)

Contribute to Safe Cargo Operations on Offshore Support Vessels covers the skills and knowledge required to undertake a range of offshore activities on board an offshore support vessel.

This unit involves the skills and knowledge required to undertake a range of offshore activities on board an offshore support vessel (OSV). It includes deck preparation, transfer of deck cargoes, bulk cargo operations and operations with deck equipment within the limits of responsibility of an integrated rating and under the direction of the officer in charge or Master.

The course is provided in a blended learning style with online learning and workplace assessment tasks.

MARA007 is a nationally recognised unit under the Australian Maritime College (RTO ID 60131) and the training outcomes are listed on www.training.gov.au.

COURSE STRUCTURE AND ASSESSMENT INFORMATION

The MARA007 Contribute to Safe Cargo Operations Course consists of:

- 11 learning resource sections including written material, images, videos and 2D and 3D eModlets.
- 15 progress checks spread throughout each section.
- Final theory assessment.
- Workplace practical assessment.

The Progress Checks require a pass mark of 100%, with unlimited attempts at each. All questions are multiple choice.

The Final Assessment is closed book and requires you to download the Respondus Lockdown Browser and have access to a webcam. Two attempts are provided, and you are required to answer 7 of 8 questions correctly to pass.

Upon successful completion of the Final Assessment, you will complete the Practical Assessment.

For the Practical Assessment, you need to demonstrate the skills and knowledge you gained from the course. Your Nominated Supervisor will monitor your progress and you are required to provide video/photo evidence for some of the tasks. These requirements are clearly noted in the information provided to you and your supervisor prior to commencing the Practical Assessment.

On successfully completing this course you will be able to:

- Recognise the characteristics of offshore vessels and their cargo, to ensure safe transfer and transport of cargo.
- Comply with legislative and organisational requirements for safe transfer and transport of offshore vessel cargo.
- Take precautions to prevent hazards.
- Respond to hazardous situation.
- Take precautions to prevent pollution of the environment from the release of liquid or dry bulk cargoes.
